



Year 6 Central Data Report

Dear Parents/Carers,

Your child's Year 6 central data report is now available to access via Xpressions. The report contains the following information:

Summary

- **Attendance and Lates:** This figure displays the percentage attendance and number of late instances for your child for the current year. It also shows the year group average for comparison.
- **Achievement:** This figure displays the total number of achievement points your child has received for the current year. This figure includes all achievement points issued outside of lesson time. It also shows the year group average for comparison.
- **Equipment:** This figure displays the total number of incidents where your child did not have the appropriate equipment. It also shows the year group average for comparison.
- **Homework:** This figure displays the total number of incidents where your child did not complete their homework task, or meet the submission date. It also shows the year group average for comparison.
- **Other Behaviour:** This figure displays the total number of behaviour incidents your child has been involved in, excluding equipment and homework. This figure includes all behaviour incidents outside of lesson time. It also shows the year group average for comparison.

Class Breakdown

- **Achievement:** This figure displays the total number of achievement points your child has received in that subject.
- **Equipment:** This figure displays the total number of instances where your child has not had the correct equipment in that tutor time or particular subject. A score of zero is excellent as it equates to your child having all of their equipment 100% of the time. This means they are showcasing a good attitude to their learning through their organisational skills and also not wasting any lesson time by having to borrow equipment.
- **Homework:** This figure displays the total number of instances where your child has not completed a homework task, or has not met the submission date, in that subject. A score of zero is excellent as it equates to 100% of your child's homework tasks completed and submitted on time.
- **Other Behaviour:** This figure displays the total number of behaviour incidents your child has been involved in within that subject, excluding equipment and homework. A score of zero is excellent as it equates to your child concentrating on their work and putting in maximum effort at all times in 100% of their lessons.

There are 112 students in Year 6 and the year group have made an excellent start to the school year. Year 6 students have had over 275 lessons each since September and have settled into TDMS exceptionally well. Year 6 students have only been issued 112 behaviour points and 1 equipment sanction since the start of the academic year. This means, in nearly all lessons, students can learn in a disruption free environment and the vast majority are working exceptionally hard both in school and at home. Consequently, the Year 6 students have been issued an amazing 2926 achievement points.

Similarly, there are 896 students in total in school. There has been a total of 4141 behaviour points issued, compared to 14656 achievement points. This highlights that the vast majority of students are working exceptionally well.

Continuing to promote impeccable behaviour and effort is vital for students' success in school.

The CDR (Central Data Report) that you receive alongside this letter will be the first of CDR this year. The second CDR will be issued in spring 1 before the Year 6 parents' evening on the W/C 2 February 2022. There will also be a summative attainment report in summer 2 which report the SATS results for your child. In this report we will also be reporting on your child's academic progress.
